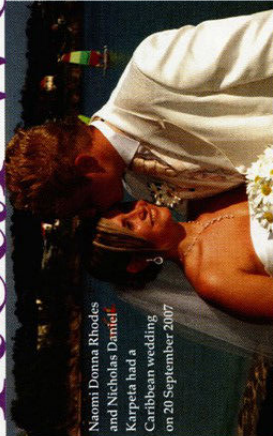

Party time!

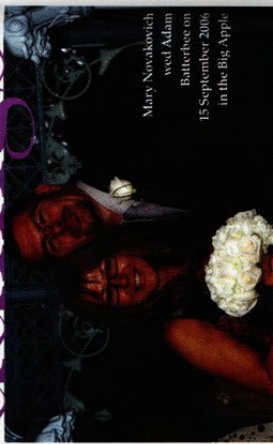

We spent our first night at the Wellington Hotel (wellingtonhotel.com) on Seventh Avenue, which is close to Broadway, Central Park and Times Square!

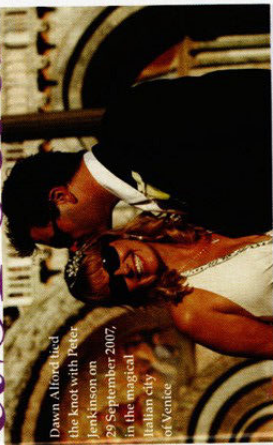
Plan it

Party time!

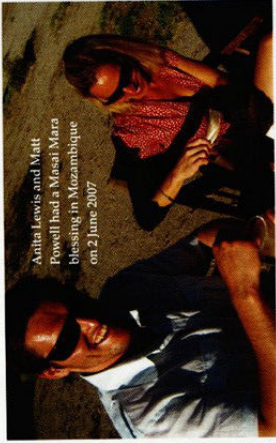

Our reception was at the Metropole Hotel (Vivaldi wrote *The Four Seasons* here). Welcome drinks were in the ornate garden and dinner was held inside the Vivaldi dining room.
